


### Aim: Exchanging information

#### Do you know?

- 1. How many people have a hearing loss in the UK? 9 million people or 1 in 7 of the population
- 2. How many of these are hard of hearing? 8.3 million people are hard of hearing
- 3. How many deaf people in the UK use sign language? 50,000 deaf people



- 4. How many deafened people are there in UK?123,000 deafened people. About 20,000 deafened people are under the age of 6.
- 5. How many deafblind are there in the UK? 24,000 deafblind people




